The Search For A Safer - And Better! - Game by Scott Kuhnen

Prior to the 2008 season, in my rounds to pre-season managers' meetings and umpire meetings, I spent the largest percentage of my time telling attendees about a game that most of them are too young to remember. That game was called "Softball."

Most players don't remember games that were won by scores like 11-9, 8-6, or 7-5. By the same token, most of today's players likely don't remember when bats cost \$30, fielder's gloves cost \$30, and shoes cost \$30. Old timers, even those who played the game after aluminum bats were introduced, recall these games fondly.

When the teams were properly classified and fairly evenly matched, these were games noted for a certain "balance" between offense vs. defense. Games were certainly not determined by the equipment in those days.

Because it was slow-pitch, all players could put the ball in play, and games were usually won by teams who had players hit the ball a little bit better than the other team, and possibly more important, championship teams could definitely field the ball better than their opponents.

In the old days, pitching was less of a factor before USSSA's unique style of pitching was permitted. However, pitching has always been something of a factor, whether directly by very effective pitching strategies, or by pitchers who could effectively field their position.

Things began to change, of course, with the introduction first of aluminum bats and solid core softballs in the late 1960's and early 1970's. Prior to that, the standard softball had a leather cover over a core made of cork and wound by yarn, and bats were like baseball bats of that day...made of wood. This was a game known as softball.

Back "in the day," players who played with true softballs knew that if you didn't hit that ball early...within the first few innings...you certainly weren't going to hit it for any distance late in the game. Back then, the ball really did "go square."

Back in the day, when we said we were playing with a "mush ball," we really meant it. Today's players like to whine and complain about the balls, but the truth is, they likely have never really experienced a true mush ball in their entire lives.

The time between the introduction in the late 1960's of aluminum bats and the early 1970's of solid core balls and the equipment of today is fairly well documented. It includes a transition to livelier balls, even some higher than .50 COR, and a transition not just into high-tech aluminum, and then titanium bats, to today's composite bats.

During that time, the game of softball has, in my opinion, morphed into a game which is out of balance with respect to offense vs. defense. The scoring has increased; the cost has increased; and, unfortunately, the risks have also increased.

To make the game safer and/or to bring the game back into balance, many people like to argue that the associations should merely outlaw certain bats. While that might be one approach, I think most people will admit that unless the associations all take a standardized approach and adopt a fully coordinated standard of performance for equipment, the manufacturers will continue to make equipment which enhances performance and can be used by at least one of the sanctioning bodies. One can hardly blame them for this.

The bat companies also should not be faulted for making and promoting equipment which both meets the standards established by the associations and at least appears to give high performance to the consumers. When it comes to bat evolution and technologies, I believe most reasonable people agree that it is simply too late to put the genie back in the bottle.

However, in my opinion, USSSA has taken a bold step forward in an attempt to make not only a safer game, but also a better game. The adoption and transition by USSSA of a .40 COR ball with a reasonable compression (325) is, in my opinion, a great stride forward in all respects.

Unlike the softball of that bygone era, the new solid core softballs of today and the future will not 'go square' and will not 'go mushy.' The ball of the future will retain all the best features of the modern era, which include your option to use leather or synthetic covers, optic yellow covers for increased visibility, long-lasting quality performance and feel, and a reasonable cost. All of these represent serious advances over the softballs of the past.

And, because the ball carries less distance than the balls of the recent past (.50 or .47 or even .44 COR), every player isn't a home run hitter and every pitched ball doesn't stand as much of a chance of becoming a dangerous batted ball.

In this just-concluded 2008 season, the Ohio Men's C State, held in Dayton, produced an exciting, safer, and lower scoring event when we used the .40 COR ball.

Analysis of scoring at World Tournament over the last few years, and especially after the introduction and use of the .40 COR ball at many of these events, has seen an overall decline when measured against the runs scored back in 2004, 2005, and 2006. In my opinion, this is a good thing.

As we continue down this path toward the use of a safer softball, I would encourage the teams to realize that this is being done very much with their interests at heart. USSSA has seen the recent past and it is hasn't been particularly pretty or safe. One could argue, in fact, that unsafe equipment has driven many players from the game.

I contend that the "fun" in a team sport tends be more noticeable on the "team" side of the game...which is defense. The game we have played for the last twenty years or so was skewed very much toward the offense. And, while I admit that offense is fun, it

tends to be more centered on the individual than on the entire team...as defense tends to be.

When fun leaves a sport, and when costs increase as they have, and when the game actually starts to scare the participants, that's when they will find other things to do.

It is true that many of the baby boomers have left the game for safer sports like fishing and golf. I believe one could also argue that many left the game when it became less fun and less safe. When batted balls were through the infield before a player could react or if a batted ball was coming at such a rate of speed that a defensive player could not react adequately to a bad hop, the result was players leaving the game. One could hardly blame them.

However, in my opinion, by USSSA taking a stand on game safety and better balance by adopting the .40 COR ball, I believe the players will find not only a safer but also a better game. I encourage directors, park managers, umpires, and even the players themselves to welcome this change as it is intended...to make for a better game for everyone.

In My Opinion by Ron Jeffers

Every year I am totally amazed when I read the rule changes that come out of the annual meetings of the ASA and USSSA organizations. One would think that they could go at least one year without making adjustments to the playing rules. When do you think they will finally get the rules to the point where they do not need to be changed or altered on an annual basis?

They have been playing the game of softball for at least 60 years now, and as far as I know, they have made some rule changes every one of those 60 years. Would you not think they could finally get the rules of the game the way they want them, and leave them alone?

Professional baseball is well over 100 years old, and they seldom ever make a change to their rules. Who knows? Maybe they think their game doesn't need an annual adjustment.

The USSSA organization had a choice to use COR 47, 44 or 40 balls this year in their program, and they made the decision to go with the 40 COR ball in every one of their classifications. I think this is a great decision, and one that should be made by the ASA organization as well, but the rule is only good if there is a punishment for those who do not honor it.

I have written in this paper before that Merle Butler, the late umpire-in-chief of ASA, told me, "I have tested thousands of softballs used in every classification of national tournament play, and yet I have never had one ball pass the COR drop test." My question of him was, "why have a rule if there is no penalty for not following it?" When you write a rule there must be a penalty for disobeying that rule. Otherwise why waste your time

writing the rule? All laws and rules must have a penalty to those who chose to ignore or disobey the laws and rules. That is the only way they make sense and are enforceable.

If the respective organizations go out and randomly purchase four dozen of each manufactures balls from around the country and perform the COR drop test on each of those balls they should pass the test. If they do not pass this simple but important test, then that manufacturers' balls should be banned from use in any games for one year. Do that and I guarantee you the ball manufacturers will produce their balls at COR 40. The problem is not with the rule. The problem is with the enforcement, or lack thereof, of this rule.

I sincerely ask: "Why do we strictly enforce all the other rules of the game, and yet this rule, governing the COR of the ball, is and has been ignored for decades. This while hundreds of players are seriously injured by these hot illegal balls coming off bats we all know to be little more than dangerous weapons.

We all talk about how corrupt Washington is, and they are. But the ASA and USSSA organizations are no better. These bat manufacturers have the ASA and USSSA leaders in their back pocket, and these legislators get enough perks and freebees that they will not do anything that will take away their gifts and hush money.

Some years ago I was in Honolulu at the ASA convention where a ball manufacturer rented two huge catamarans and took hundreds of the voting delegation and their families on an evening boat ride with all the food and drinks you could consume. Another ball manufacturer provided a wonderful breakfast in the hotel for all these same people. Another ball manufacturer provided food and drinks for an entire evening in a hospitality suite for the same group of people. All of this designed to keep the ASA voting delegation in the back pocket of these ball manufacturers, and it works.

Does there have to be corruption in every phase of our life? Can no one be honest or trusted any more? Can we not depend on people in responsible positions, as they are in both the ASA and USSSA organizations, to be honest, forthright, ethical, moral and lawabiding? Don't pass rules you knowingly have not or will not enforce. That is dishonest at best.

The rules committee has now passed a COR 40 rule for all USSSA play in 2009, and whatever the COR is in ASA for all levels of play for 2009, the rule is absolutely useless unless these two organizations finally have the guts to enforce their own rules. I don't mean to be cynical, but if this year is the same as all the past years, the COR 40 rule is useless at best. Am I crazy or what? Why go to the trouble of drafting a rule change, and getting it passed, if the governing bodies of softball will not enforce the rule? Sometimes I believe the back room politics of the Amateur Softball Association make the Illinois and Chicago political scene look like child's play.

Next month I will cover some of the other new rules that I believe the rule makers passed, that I believe make a mockery of the game, we all love.

I underwent some very serious brain surgery in early August, but I still have enough mental capacity to know why the ASA organization chooses not to enforce their own rule regarding the COR limit of their softballs. The voting members of this once proud and powerful organization continue to be bought out by a few perks from the ball manufacturers. And, if this is not true, let them tell me why they chose to not enforce this one rule of the game?

Well, as always, that is my opinion. What is yours?

January 2009: What's Your Gripe? by Ron Jeffers

Q. Ron, this mess happened in our fall league and I was wondering if you could straighten it out for me. We had one out and a runner on 2nd base, and our batter doubled him home safely. Unfortunately, the runner on 2nd missed 3rd base en route to the plate. The 3rd baseman then made a proper appeal, and the umpire called the baserunner out. Then, before the next pitch, the team in the field discovered that the runner on 2nd had batted out of order. The umpire called the batter out and put the baserunner who had been called out for missing 3rd back on 2nd base. Was this right?

A. I have been bombarded with weird questions about baseball and softball for most of my life, and I have studied the rules for decades, but this is a new one for me. I have not been stumped in forever, but this play is one for the books. I have not had anyone confront me with this play, but we can break it down and figure it out.

Lets break this play down by the playing rules and see what we come up with. A legal appeal play for missing a base or leaving a base before a batted ball is first touched must be made before the next pitch. The team in the field made a good and proper appeal on the runner missing third base, and the umpire called the base runner out. This was all correct.

Where the play gets complicated is determining if you are referring to the batter batting out of order, or the runner who started the play at second base. If you are saying the batter who hit the double batted out of order, then the runner who scored would go back to second base, and the batter who should have batted would be called out.

If you are saying the runner who scored batted out of order, you can no longer appeal this rule violation, because a pitch had already been delivered to the succeeding batter. The result of this would be the runner who scored would be called out, the batter would be at second base, and the umpire gets a grade of A+.

Only one out is made either way. If you are appealing the batter who hit the double batted out of order, then the batter who should have batted is called out, and the runner who scored is returned to second base. If you are appealing the runner who scored batted out

of order, you are too late. The appeal must be made before the next pitch, and you delivered at least one pitch, because the next batter hit a double.

No one has ever asked me this question in my life, but when you dissect the play it is quite easy by rule.

Q. I read that Jerry Fick is being inducted into the Cincinnati Softball Hall of Fame this January, and I understand he started his career working for you. Do you have any thoughts on whether he's qualified to be in the Hall of Fame?

A. I could talk about Jerry and his life for hours, and in so doing it would all be positive.

Jerry was not an athlete, but he had a phenomenal knowledge about every aspect of sports. I taught Jerry to umpire youth baseball in the basement of my home, and he was exceptional on the playing rules from the very beginning. His only problem as a young umpire was teaching him what to call and when to call it. He knew the rules as they were written, but he had to learn the intent of the rules. He was an outstanding student at Greenhills High School and the University of Cincinnati, and he worked in the office of the Queen City Umpires for me, and umpired seven days a week as well.

Jerry officiated football and basketball as well as baseball and softball, and I only wish his father could have lived to see him succeed in every one of these sports while climbing to the top in the business management field.

The two umpires I had the privilege to work with and who got more out of their Godgiven ability, and succeeded far beyond anyone's expectations were the late Les Treitel and Jerry Fick.

I think every teacher or coach loves to tell the story about the kid who was an over-achiever, and the kid who succeeded when no one thought they could or would. This was Jerry Fick, but he would have made it to the top in any field of endeavor he chose to follow.

I remember when I was asked to provide umpires to work in the National League of Professional Baseball on two separate occasions, and one of the umpires I selected was Jerry Fick. I caught Holy Hell from several of my 300 other umpires, and those were the ones who had the guts to tell me to my face. They thought Jerry was either not experienced enough, not good enough, too young or too close a friend to me. In other words they, should have been selected to work these games and not Jerry. They never questioned who I selected to work the class D games at Salway Fields, just the games on National television in Riverfront Stadium. Well, I selected Jerry, and he did a magnificent job, as I knew he would, and yes, he worked the plate too.

When I was conducting clinics all around the country, I would take Jerry with me, and I would give him a rule or two to teach that weekend, and this was great experience for him. Now he is conducting clinics around the United States and in Europe.

Wasn't there a childhood book about a little train that could? Jerry has always been a person who has been an over-achiever, and now he is going in the Hall of Fame, and I couldn't be prouder.

I hope I am well enough to be in the audience the Sunday they give him the well deserved Plaque.

The 2009 Cincinnati Recreation Commission Adult Softball Program will begin priority registration for teams who played in the spring of 2008 on Monday, February 2nd and run through Friday, February 13th. New team registration will begin Tuesday, February 17th, and continue until all leagues are filled.

Lighted Leagues and Sunday Afternoon Leagues will begin play the week of April 5th. These leagues will play at various fields around Cincinnati and will use an eight game season format. The fee for all lighted leagues is \$350 (8 games). The fee for Sunday afternoon (unlighted) leagues is \$285 (8 games).

Twilight Leagues (unlighted) will begin the week of April 19th. These leagues will play at various fields around Cincinnati and will use a ten game season format. The fee for twilight leagues is \$345 (10 games).

APPLICATIONS AND PAYMENTS

Applications and payment will be accepted at the CRC Athletic Office Monday through Friday from 8:00 AM until 4:30 PM. Payment may be made with cash (in person only), check, money order or Visa/MasterCard. Norwood Sorrento's Softball Hall Of Fame Banquet Set For January 25th At Radisson Hotel; WCPO-TV Sports Anchor Dennis Janson To MC

The Norwood Sorrento's Softball Hall of Fame Committee has set Sunday, January 25th, as the date for this year's induction banquet for six new Hall of Famers.

This year's banquet will once again be held at the Radisson Hotel Cincinnati Riverfront in Covington. Inductees will be Dan DeClaire in the Sponsor Category, Dick Ernst in the Senior Player Category, Jerry Fick in the Umpire Category, Marsha Friedhoff in the Female Player Category, and Randy Lewis and Dale Overmann in the Male Player Category.

The six new inductees will bring the local Hall of Fame membership to 139.

The ceremony this winter will mark the fifth year that the induction ceremony has been held at the Radisson.

Norwood Sorrento's Softball Hall of Fame Committee member Jim Chastang calls the Radisson Hotel in Covington a "Northern Kentucky landmark of luxury."

Just across the Ohio River from downtown Cincinnati, the Radisson is "a famous feature of the Greater Cincinnati landscape," says Chastang.

Later, while an employee of WKRC-AM/WKRQ-FM, he made the move down the hall to their television affiliate, where he launched the career that brought him to WCPO-TV in 1984. Janson's stock in trade is breaking stories, but "getting it right" is first and foremost for the Indian Hill resident. Janson never loses sight of his roots, his association with UC, or the many organizations and charities he's helped by hosting or presiding over their event as master of ceremonies.

32nd Annual ASA Metro Rules Clinic February 28-March 1 At St. Rita's School For The Deaf

The 32nd Annual ASA Metro Rules Clinic has been scheduled for February 28-March 1 at St. Rita School for the Deaf in Evendale.

Amateur Softball Association Deputy Supervisor of Umpires Julie Johnson of Alexandria, In., will be the guest clinician at the 32nd Annual ASA Metro Rules Clinic February 28-March 1 at St. Rita School for the Deaf in Evendale.

Now entering its 32nd year, the two-day clinic "is one of the two longest running clinics in the country with a member of the National Umpire Staff helping to conduct the clinic," points out Fick. "Only one other clinic (Dallas, Tx.) has been operating longer than the Cincinnati clinic."

Fick says that topics will include "new rules, interpretations, and tournament procedures, with an emphasis on umpire mechanics.

Eight Greater Cincinnati Teams Reclassified By USSSA State, National Rules

Eight Greater Cincinnati teams will be required to move up in classification for the 2009 season by USSSA National and State Rules and By-Laws.

USSSA National By-Laws require the winner of all Men's and Women's National and World Tournaments with 25 or more teams, the top ten percent of the finishing teams in the Men's Class "C," "D" and "E," and Women's "D" World Tournaments, and the top six finishers in the Mixed "D" World Tournament to compete the following year in a higher classification.

Three Greater Cincinnati men's teams will be required to move up in class for 2009 according to USSSA National By-Laws.

PRI/Easton of Cincinnati finished 2nd in the USSSA Men's "C" World September 18-21 in Sterling Heights, Mi., and will be required to play "B" or higher in 2009. Hill & Griffith and Crosley's Sports Bar, both of Cincinnati, finished 4th and 9th, respectively, in the USSSA Women's "D" World September 18-21 in Kissimmee, Fl. and will be required to play "C" or higher in 2009.

Ohio USSSA State By-Laws requiring teams to move up in class are as follows: the winner of the Men's Class "D" and Mixed Couples Class "D" State Tournaments; and winner and runner-up of the Men's Class "E" and Mixed "E" State Tournaments.

Teams affected by Ohio USSSA State Rules will include: Cousin Construction, the winner of the Men's "D" State; OC Softball and D & D/Dirty Dozen of Cincinnati, the 2nd and 3rd place finishers in the "E" State; and Steel Softball of Blanchester, which finished 2nd in the Mixed "E" State.

Kentucky USSSA State By-Laws also require the winner (and runner-up based on 25 or more teams) of the Men's "D" and "E" State Tournaments to play at a higher class the following year. The only local team affected by this by-law will be Kentucky USSSA "D" State Champion Renegades of Taylor Mill, Ky.

USSSA State and National By-Laws are in effect if a team retains any four players from its roster from the previous season. Teams affected by National By-Laws may appeal after competing in four tournaments in their new classification (two tournaments in the

Mixed program). Appeals must be made between June 1st and July 1st (October 1st in the Mixed program). Appeals must be made to a committee including the respective State Director, National Program Director, Vice-President and Assistant Executive Director.

USSSA National Appeal forms can be downloaded at usssa.com.

Teams affected by Ohio USSSA By-Laws must appeal to both the State Director and District Director. Teams wishing to file an appeal must first compete in at least four tournaments in their new classification (two in the Mixed program). No appeals will be accepted after July 1st.

The National Appeal form can also be used by teams moved up by Ohio State By-Laws.

2008 Membership Approaches 200,000 Mark...

USSSA Announces International Partnerships, Inducts Ten More Hall Of Famers At 41st National Meeting

ChampionsGate, Fl.--The United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA) celebrated nearing the 200,000 member milestone at its 41st Annual National Meeting November 16-23 at the Omni Orlando Resort at ChampionsGate, Fl., with the announcement of several groundbreaking new partnerships and programs, and the induction of ten new members into its Hall of Fame.

The Association also passed twenty-four rule changes and twelve by-law changes and approved an updated constitution.

"We also need to continue to be an innovative and forward-thinking organization with each sport and director working in tandem together as one team. Our goals and long-term success will rely on such co-operation, remembering that our objectives as an association are one and the same," said DeDonatis.

DeDonatis encouraged the Association's State Directors to "go out and make a difference, to improve your programs, and to promote and expand participation.

"We can and must do it better than we have in the past," said DeDonatis.

In closing, DeDonatis stated that the USSSA's "progressive and innovative approach has proven time and again to be our strength.

"USSSA has continued to raise the bar and set our standards high. Much is expected of us and I have no doubt that we will continue to meet these expectations. Let us move forward today, with the realization that there is much more work to do and new challenges that need to be met," said DeDonatis.

Highlighting the new partnerships and programs for USSSA in 2009 will be "USSSA Today," a new publication designed to showcase all of the association's sports; usssalive.com, which will provide live video of USSSA events; Slugfest, a bat comparison program; and Slo-Pitch Ontario, a Canadian-based group which will exchange teams with USSSA to bring an international flavor to both organizations' events.

USSSA's baseball also announced an international program, which will conduct "All-American Games" to serve as a selection process to send an All-American team to Japan in 2010. A new division of USSSA baseball called Global Sports, which is designed to provide more teams with post-season play options, was also launched at the convention.

Among the rule and by-law changes passed at its convention, the USSSA will require all balls to have an optic yellow cover beginning in 2010. Also, beginning in 2009, teams will be permitted to replace up to four players released from their rosters with an add on, and State Directors have been given the authority to make roster additions within 72 hours in case of an emergency.

The USSSA inducted ten new members into its Hall of Fame. They included Todd Martin (NC), Jason Kendrick (FL) and Rick Weiterman (WI) in the male player category, Marie Pesch (TX) in the female player category, Gene Williams (NY) and Louis Calvisi (MI) in the manager category, Travis Resmondo (FL) in the sponsor category, Kevin Naegele (NM) and Bill Hensley (IN) in the executive category, and Dick Calvo (WA) in the special service category.

The ten will be inducted during a Hall of Fame banquet at the USSSA National Meeting on November 15-22 at the Pechanga Resort & Casino, Temecula, CA.

Ten new candidates were selected for induction in 2009. They were Don Clatterbough (VA), Dennis Rulli (CA) and Andy Purcell (CA) in the male player category; Meme Vencil Peterson (OH) in the female player category; Jeff Miller (GA), John Rechtor (MI) in the manager category; Joey Odom (LA) in the Executive category; Dale McGregor (WA) in the umpire category; Special Service Longevity Category; and Jay Cressione (SC), Gerry Turnberg (MN) in the Special Service Longevity Category.

ChampionsGate, Fl.-A veteran of twelve World Series, a seven time member of the USSSA Women's World Series All-Tournament team, a manager of four Mixed World champions, an official who has umpired over 60,000 games, and an Executive Vice President, are among ten individuals who have been selected for induction into the USSSA Hall of Fame in 2009.

Elected at the USSSA National Meeting November 16-23 in ChampionsGate, Fl. were Dennis Rulli (CA), Andy Purcell (CA), Don Clatterbaugh (VA), Meme Vencil Peterson (OH), John Rechtor (MI), Jeff Miller (GA), Dale McGregor (WA), Jay Cressione (SC), Gerry Turnberg (MN) and Joey Odom (LA).

The ten will be inducted during the Hall of Fame induction banquet at the USSSA National Meeting on November 15-22 in Temecula, Ca.

Known for his trademark "fu manchu" mustache, high leg kick and blistering line drives, Don Clatterbaugh has racked up 13 MVP awards in USSSA tournament play over the years, and has played in a dozen World Series with teams like Dave Carroll Sports, Steele's Sports, Howard's, Blanton's and Dan Smith. His approximate lifetime batting average is .720 and he had hit over 1,500 home runs.

Michelle "Meme" Vencil Peterson captured USSSA World Championships with Lady Blue (1991, 1992 and 1993) and UPI (1995 and 1998). She was selected to the All-World teams in 1992, 1993, 1995 1996 1997, 1998 and 2001. During her 18-year playing career from 1983 through 2001, she was named to 81 all-tournament teams. She was also the Most Valuable Player at the 1993 World Series.

Jeff Miller managed his Action Awards/TPS teams to USSSA Mixed World titles in 1990, 1991, 1994 and 1996. In 37 U-Trip NIT's, Miller's teams won 22 and finish second nine times. Rick Weiterman captured USSSA World Series championships with Elite Coatings, Steele's Silver Bullets, Ritch's Superior and Team TPS. Known as one of the premier pitchers of his era, Weiterman also boasted a .719 batting average.

Marie Pesch has won seven USSSA Women's World Series championships while competing with teams like Cannon's Illusions, UPI and Kinder Sharks. She was a seventime All-World Series pick and named the Outstanding Offensive Player in the Series in 1993, 1995 and 2004.

USSSA Awards Twenty Eight National Invitationals To Greater Cincinnati Parks For 2009; Over 400 Teams Competed In 2008 Events

ChampionsGate, Fl.--The United States Specialty Sports Association has awarded twenty eight National Invitational Tournaments to Greater Cincinnati area softball complexes for 2009, including a Men's Major NIT, seven Men's "B-C's," six "C-D's" or "C," six "D"'s, five Women's NIT's, five Mixed, and a One-Pitch.

Last year over 400 teams competed in area USSSA National Invitationals.

The U-Trip Major NIT, which will be held July 17-19, will once again thrust the Cincinnati area into the national limelight. Last year's monster 62-team event was won by Resmondo/Specialty Tank/Worth, which outlasted Jean Shoppe/Easton 36-35 in a double finals to complete a six game sweep.

The 62-team field was believed to be the largest U-Trip Major NIT ever held, as "C" and "D" teams vied for \$500 travel expense and a paid berth to their respective World Tournaments.

Ranking next on the classification ladder will be the 30th Annual Louisville Slugger-Bud Light-USSSA Men's "B-C" Early Bird Round Robin NIT on March 28-29. Last year's title was captured by Blitz/Watanabe/Bull/Minges/Wessel/Easton, which fended off House Rules/Holy Grail/Crosley's 17-14 in the championship game to complete a four game sweep of the sixteen team event.

Again this year, the Early Bird NIT will feature paid berths to USSSA "B" and "C" World Tournaments plus travel expense.

Six other USSSA "B-C" NIT's, all sponsored by Worth and Bud Light and featuring direct berths to the USSSA "B" World, have been slated for three area complexes in 2009. These events will also carry a berth to the USSSA "C" World September 24-27 in Lake Buena Vista, Fl.

A week after the Louisville Slugger on April 4-5, action moves to Mid-America Ballyard, where last season Blitz/Watanabe notched their second straight NIT title of the young 2008 campaign, albeit the hard way. After being ambushed by EAP/Wessel/Real Estate Title/Easton 11-10 in the second round, Blitz marched past seven opponents in the losers' bracket of the 21-team tournament, and double-dipped Mike Foulks Auto Body/Team Insanity 15-14 and 12-10.

Expressway Park in Milford is the next stop on the "B-C" circuit with an April 11th offering. Last year Mike Foulks avenged their setbacks to Blitz the previous weekend,

stunning the city's number one team 24-7 and 14-4 to complete a four game sweep of the twelve team affair.

Action returns to Harrison three weeks later for the 9th Annual Bud Light-Worth "B-C" NIT on May 2-3. Mojo/Creative Stucco/Worth outlasted EAP/Wessel/Real Estate Title/Easton 23-12 in the second championship game after being ambushed 12-9 in the first finals.

Two weeks later on May 16th, Expressway Park will host their third of three "B-C" NIT's for 2009. House Rules/Holy Grail/Crosley's routed K . G. Sports/Game On/Easton 18-6 in last year's championship game to wrap up a 4-0 day and best a twelve-team field.

Two weekends after that, on May 29-31, the competition returns to Mid-america for the 8th Annual "City Slam" NIT, where last season a red-hot Mike Foulks squad outdueled a 17-team field en route to racking up their third NIT championship in a six-week span with a flawless 5-0 performance. Mike Foulks overcame a 24-5 deficit to outlast Spitz Seeds/Mizuno 26-25 in the championship game.

The curtain will fall on the 2009 "B-C" NIT season five weeks later on June 20 at Expressway Park, where last summer Blitz/Watanabe rolled to their third NIT title of the year, polishing off Mojo/Creative Stucco/Worth 19-11 in the finals to go 5-0.

The Greater Cincinnati area will host six U-Trip "C" or "C-D" NIT's in 2009. Among the returning events will be the 8th Annual "Bash for Cash" at Kolping Park on March 21-22, followed by the 7th Annual Easton "Westside Rumble" NIT June 6th in Harrison, a third year event on June 27-28 at Riverstar, followed by a July 11-12 offering at Expressway.

Each tournament will again feature a paid USSSA to the "C" World Tournament berth plus \$600 in travel money based on 13 teams. And all but the June 7th date will be "C-D" events and offer a paid berth to the "D" World, September 24-27 in Sterling Heights, Mi.

Last year in March, JLC/Legends outlasted EAP/Easton 20-13 in the second championship game of the 15-team"Bash for Cash" USSSA C NIT.

In the 11-team Westside Rumble at Pastime, EAP double-dipped eventual U-Trip "C" World runner-up PRI/Easton 11-16 and 11-10, rallying all the way back from a first round loss to JLC. EAP made it two in a row three weekends later at Riverstar in the area's largest "C-D" NIT of the year, once again tripping up PRI/Easton in a double finals, 14-12 and 22-7.

Then in Milford, House Rules/Holy Grail/Crosley's rolled to their third NIT title of the year, polishing off Design Concepts 21-10 in the championship game to complete a five game sweep of the 23-team field.

Launching the area's returning "D" NIT's will be the 8th Annual "Bash for Cash" on March 13-15 at Rivershore in Hebron, Ky., followed two weekends later by a March 28-29 affair at Riverstar. Another Rivershore event is slated for April 11th, then an eighth year NIT - the "Bud Light-Worth" - will follow on April 25-26 at Expressway Park. The Easton "Westside Rumble" at Mid-America Ballyard will cap off the area "D" NIT's on June 6-7.

The "Bash for Cash" "D" NIT, the largest in the tri-state with forty teams, was captured by Miller Builders/Mast Home Center, who romped past Sunrise Dental 19-6 in the championship game to compile a 7-0 record. Two weeks later, Airtight Construction of West Virginia brushed aside the Renegades 19-8 to complete a four game sweep of an eleven team field.

In late April in Milford, Extreme/Turner Property Services Group shut out Cousin Construction 10-0 in the championship game to successfully defend their title in the twenty team Louisville Slugger/TPS "D" NIT.

Then in June, eventual Great Lakes Division National Champion BCP Associates/ASC/Big Sonny's held off Clark County Merchants 11-10 in the second championship game to capture first place in the Easton-Westside Rumble..

Each "D" NIT offers a paid berth to the USSSA "D" World September 24-27 in Sterling Heights, Mi., plus \$600 travel expense based on thirteen teams.

<u>Florence Couple Purchase Lease, Promise Major Improvements...</u> Jeff And Denise Conley To Operate Northern Kentucky Sports Complex In 2009

Taylor Mill, Ky. -- The winds of change are blowing at Northern Kentucky Sports Park.

And fanning those winds are a Florence, Ky. couple who have purchased the lease to operate the Taylor Mill softball complex in 2009.

Jeff and Denise Conley, a pair of systems analysts employed at Convergys in Cincinnati, took over the park's lease in December. Since then they have worked feverishly towards their goal of restoring the once proud facility to like-new condition. The new lessees promise extensive improvements in park operations as well.

"Since we purchased the lease, the two outer buildings have been completely cleaned out to make room for storage and vehicles," Jeff Conley told the Softball News in late November. "Currently we're starting to revamp the concession area and clean it out and

paint it and install new floors. We're also putting a new roof on. The shingles will be delivered this week. The play area will also be redone, and the outfields have been aerated, double-seeded and fertilized for the first time in years. We hope to get the scoreboards working by the beginning of the season, and the lips between the outfield and infield are being removed. Also home plate is being pushed out approximately ten feet to increase the foul area and give players more room and to improve viewing."

Conley says that a concession area will be built on field three and that concession prices will undergo a "major overhauling.

"We're also going back to Coca-Cola," says Conley. "The park went to RC last year and a lot of people complained about it.

"Overall we're just repainting and cleaning up as best as we can right now," says Conley. "Eventually we're looking at new fencing, but we're not going to be able to do that this year."

Conley says he and his wife first got involved with the park last spring.

"My oldest son plays for the Northern Kentucky Knights, which was sponsored by the park," explains Conley. "The park needed some help last year, so we came in and tried to help them get their books squared away. Eventually Mr. Dixon (park owner Robbie Dixon) asked us if we wanted to take over the lease the end of December."

Conley's wife's interest in owning a business, along with an attraction to the park's atmosphere held by two of the couple's three sons, played a big role in the family's decision to take the park over.

"Denise likes the idea of owning her own business and being her own boss," says Conley. "And even though she's not quitting her day job, there's the potential for that. And if we can get the park cleaned up and purchase it, we would like to see that happen eventually. She was the manager of a Long John Silver's restaurant so she has a concession-restaurant background.

"Also," adds Conley, "my kids enjoy being around the park. My 16-year old is obsessed with baseball, and my 5-year old would live up here if you let him."

The Conley's have three boys: Jeremy (16), Justin (14) and Josh (5).

Conley says that Denise will be the park manager. Dan Nunn, the groundskeeper and assistant park manager last season, will be in charge of slow pitch and fast pitch softball, and Rodney Sexton will return as the park's baseball director.

"I'll be overseeing all the financials and the concession stand and doing all the ordering," says Denise. "Dan will take care of the grounds and scheduling the teams, and I'll be overseeing the entire park."

Jeff Conley promises that the park will be "friendlier" beginning next season.

"Our patrons will find that we're willing to work with them, and that we won't be showing any favoritism towards any teams. Also we'll be increasing umpire pay to match what other parks pay, and we'll be outsourcing our umpire scheduling to Pam Hardy. The buck will stop with her on controversial calls - not the park."

Working scoreboards, a beer garden, additional seating, batting cages, cornhole and wi-fi are also in the works for 2009.

"We think that will be a really nice feature for businessmen who come up here after work," says Conley regarding the wi-fi. "Our goal is to put as many things up here as possible to keep people here, plus to provide a clean and friendly environment."

Long-term goals include new fencing, blacktopping the parking lot and increasing the length of the building so the park can operate indoor "winter rag ball leagues.

"That would enable us to generate money all year long," says Conley.

Rumors began spreading shortly after the Conley's took over the park that it would become almost exclusively a baseball facility. But Conley says that simply not true.

"We had about 65 softball teams last year, and we hope to increase that to 100 in 2009," he says. "Baseball will be more of a weekend tournament type thing through the early summer months. We want softball nightly and men's round robins and qualifiers and state tournaments. And if someone tells us they want to put on a tournament, we'll throw it in here. We do have weekends available."

The facility, which will now be known as "Northern Kentucky Sports Complex," doesn't plan on offering fast pitch tournaments. But it will be the home field for Holy Cross High School and run a high school league on Thursday afternoons for six weeks in the summer.

"Those games will be over before softball starts," notes Conley.

League fees and formats will be the same as last season, when an eight game spring and summer season were offered followed by fall double-header leagues.

"Teams can sign up now on our website (www.nkscx.com) or they can call the park at 581-PARK (7275)," says Conley.

Baseball tournaments for 2009 are already posted on the park's website. A slow pitch calendar should be up by mid-December. The season will kick off with the 8th Annual "Bash for Cash" on March 13-15.

Denise Conley says she and her husband are both "excited and nervous about our new venture.

"We will make mistakes, and we ask that people don't hesitate to let us know. We want to be fair so people will enjoy themselves and come back. Last year there were a lot of issues with customer service, which is very important to us."

Ten NIT's, Four State Tourneys, Great Lakes Nationals Highlight 2009 Expressway Calendar

New Manager Bill Chard Making Improvements, Changing Image Of Kolping Park

After spending the last five years at Riverstar Sportsplex, park manager Bill Chard will be hanging out his shingle at a new facility in 2009: Kolping Park.

Chard, part of the Wessel Sports team that once operated five tri-state softball complexes, couldn't resist the offer of more money, less responsibility, and greater job security and stability at Kolping.

"Kolping has had the same ownership since the park was opened. It's not been in limbo every year like Riverstar," says Chard.

Chard also got a hefty raise and will only be overseeing a three-diamond facility at Kolping compared to five fields at Riverstar. "This was best for me and my family," he says.

Chard says he loved working at Riverstar, which was close to his home in Ft. Thomas, Ky., and where he had made many friends with players and umpires. But after the death of owner Jim Wessel last September, his future at the park became uncertain.

"When I first saw the Kolping post on cincysoftball.com that they were looking for a manager, I wasn't interested," recalls Chard. "But when things became unstable at Riverstar, I emailed my resume."

Ten days later, Chard got a call to come in for an interview. After a subsequent interview two days later, he was offered the position.

Kolping's previous manager had resigned in mid-season.

Since accepting the Kolping job in mid-November, Chard has set about "to change the entire image of the park.

"Kolping has become known as a park that never plays when it rains, that doesn't answer the phone, and doesn't offer a tournament program," says Chard.

That image is going to be different, he promises.

"We've made numerous improvements already," says Chard. "Rainouts will be reduced as we've installed new infields. And for the first time ever, the park will have a full-time field crew. Kolping also has its own website now - www.kolpingpark.com - where teams can obtain league and tournament information. And we're upgrading the umpiring because of our improved training system.

"We're also adding a full-line pro shop offering softball apparel and merchandise and custom ordering," adds Chard. "And we're enclosing the pavilion and re-opening the bar and expanding the menu. Those are just a few of the things we're doing."

Two things that won't change, says Chard, will be Kolping's successful league program and atmosphere.

"We're still offering the same men's and mixed leagues Sunday through Friday. Teams shouldn't notice any change there. And we'll still have the same safe, clean park with a fun, family atmosphere and free gate admission."

Probably Chard's biggest challenge will be resurrecting Kolping's tournament program, which crash-burned following the 2006 season. Prior to that, Kolping's tournament program was the envy of the west side of town. Saturday USSSA qualifiers, and Saturday night and Sunday morning round robins were as dependable as death and taxes.

"The previous management didn't want to run tournaments," says Chard. "I'm committed to working seven days a week and to getting the tournament program back to where it was and even beyond."

Indeed. Kicking off Kol ping's 2009 season on March 13-15 will be the 8th annual "Bash For Cash" which will include showcasing some of the best players in the country in a home run derby on Friday night.

"That usually draws a nice crowd of well over 1,000 people," says Chard, who had headquartered the event at Riverstar the last five years.

In an effort to rebuild Kolping's once popular Saturday night round robins, Kolping will introduce the "Budweiser Round Robin Series" this year. "We'll have our own points

system on the internet, and the top sixteen teams will compete in September to win a Kolping Park sponsorship valued at over \$3,500," says Chard.

Chard says that these events and the park's Sunday morning round robins will be held as USSSA qualifiers instead of unsanctioned round robins for the first time this year for two reasons. "First, this will help teams that want to get USSSA points to qualify for the world and get better seeds in tournaments. And secondly, in this sue-happy world we live in, it will help protect our umpires and the park with insurance."

What can Kolping patrons expect from Bill Chard this year?

"They'll get a fair, hard-working park director who will be there to answer any questions and concerns the teams might have, and somebody who has over twenty years experience in softball and customer service."

USSSA Major NIT, City Slam Are Marquis Mid-America Ballyard Events For 2009; Tournaments To Award Over \$20,000 In Team Travel

Colerain Township, Oh.--With combined purses in excess of \$20,000, the 7th Annual USSSA "City Slam" and a Men's Major National Invitational Tournament will again be the marquee events on a 30-weekend Mid-America Ballyard softball calendar in 2009.

Located on Blue Rock Road at East Miami River Road, Mid-America Ballyard – formerly Eggleston Park - features four lighted, irrigated diamonds with electronic scoreboards, a family atmosphere, an abundance of shade trees, and Mid-America's exclusive, two story clubhouse featuring the "On Deck Sports Bar."

The Billy Backman IV Memorial "City Slam," which will be held on May 22-24 (Men's "C" and "D" and Women's divisions) and May 29-31 (Men's "B-C NIT," "E" and "E Rec" divisions). The U-Trip Major NIT, which will be held July 17-19, looms once again as a national leviathon in terms of regular season events drawing both large numbers of teams and nationally prominent ones. Last year's monster 62-team event was won by Resmondo/Specialty Tank/Worth, which outlasted Jean Shoppe/Easton 36-35 in a double finals to complete a six game sweep.

The 62-team field is considered to be the largest U-Trip Major NIT ever held, as "C" and "D" teams vied for \$500 travel expense and a paid berth to their respective World Tournaments.

"We're extremely pleased to have been selected as one of the sites for a USSSA Major NIT again," says the Ballyard's David Maury. "It's an honor to have the best softball teams in the nation playing at our facility. And the lure of \$500 travel expense and a paid World berth should attract plenty of class "C" and "D" teams" again.

The Major NIT will be one of four USSSA NIT's at the park in 2009. Mid-American Ballyard will host a U-Trip "B-C" NIT on April 4 and May 29-31, and a "D" NIT on June 6-7. Both "B-C" NIT's will be offering a paid "C" World berth. The winner of the "B" berth will advance to Lake Buena Vista, Fl. September 18-20 with \$600 in travel expense (based on 13 teams). The winners of the "C" World berths qualify for the U-Trip "C" World September 24-27 - also in Lake Buena Vista. The June 6-7 "D" NIT will also feature \$600 in travel expense and a paid World berth to Sterling Heights, Mi. September 24-27.

The Easton Bring Your Real Skills wraps up the month of July on the 25th and 26th, followed by the Nazarene National Tournament September 4-5 and a "Pre-World Cash Bash." The Cincysoftball.com "Super Draft IV" on October 3-4, an "Appreciation Tournament" October 17-18, the "Halloween-Wooden Bat-Cash Cow" on Saturday, October 31st, and then the 2nd Annual Toys for Tots on November 7th will bring down the curtain on the 2009 season.

The June Cash Cow, which had previously been run earlier in the Spring at the park, will "give teams a chance to earn some money to help them with league and tournament entry fees," says David Maury.

"The payout will be based on participation," he adds.

The Easton "Bring Your Real Skills" Tournament gives players an opportunity to showcase their hitting skills "while all swinging the exact same bats," says Maury.

"The winners will get a set of Easton bats, and second and third place will probably get shirts, hats or batting gloves.

The "Pre-World Cash Bash" will help teams earn monies to use to advance to their respective USSSA World Tournaments, says Maury.

In addition to their NIT's and special events, Mid-America Ballyard will offer two series this year, including a second year program - the "Pepsi Metro Series," and an all new program, the "USSSA World Travel Series."

"The Pepsi Series gives teams a chance to earn points, and after the series, the top point recipient will get their entry fee paid into the Metro Tournament," explains Maury.

The "USSSA World Travel Series" also utilizes a point system.

"Teams earn points for participation, and when the series is over, we'll be awarding cash to help teams travel to the USSSA World," says Maury.

Park Manager David Maury says tournament participants will appreciate the park's heated clubhouse during the late spring and early fall tournaments.

"Our patrons can escape the cold weather in the early spring and late fall by taking advantage of our clubhouse between their games," points out Maury. "And on hot summer days they'll enjoy the air conditioning."

Five USSSA NIT's, Big "D" And "E," Two State Tournaments Highlight 2009 Pastime Park Calendar

Harrison, OH.--Five United States Specialty Sports Association National Invitational Tournaments and two USSSA State Championships will be among the major events highlighting a 35-weekend 2009 tournament calendar at Pastime Park in Harrison.

Pastime's National Invitational Tournaments are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation. They include two Men's "B-C" NIT's, a Men's "C" NIT, a Women's NIT and a Mixed Couples NIT.

Kicking off the park's NIT program will be the 31st Annual Louisville Slugger-Bud Light-USSSA Men's "B-C" Early Bird Round Robin NIT on March 28-29. Last year's title was captured by Blitz/Watanabe/Bull/Minges/Wessel/Easton, which fended off House Rules/Holy Grail/Crosley's 17-14 in the championship game to complete a four game sweep of the sixteen team event.

Again this year, the Early Bird NIT will feature paid berths to USSSA "B" and "C" World Tournaments plus travel expense.

Pastime Park's next NIT will be the 9th Annual Bud Light-Worth "B-C" NIT on May 2-3. Like the "Early Bird" NIT, the event will also feature a direct paid berth to the USSSA Men's "B" and "C" Worlds, plus \$600 in sponsor travel expense money (based on 13 teams.

Mojo/Creative Stucco/Worth outlasted EAP/Wessel/Real Estate Title/Easton 23-12 in the second championship game after being ambushed 12-9 in the first finals.

Also in May will be the 27th Annual Worth-Bud Light Mixed Couples NIT on Sunday, May 17th. A U-Trip World qualifier, this long-standing classic offers World Tournament berths to the Mixed "C" World Tournament in West Columbia, SC, and the Mixed "D" and "E" Worlds in Lake Buena Vista, Fl. All three events will be held on October 16-18.

Crosley's stunned Thornton's 13-12 in the "C-D" division finals last year on the strength of a five-run rally in the bottom of the 7th. D's Restoration swept past three opponents for the "E" title.

The following month on June 6-7, Pastime will host two divisions of the Easton Westside Rumble, a U-Trip "C" NIT and "E" World qualifier that will boast a lavish awards package compliments of Easton Sports. In 2008, EAP/Wessel/Real Estate Title/QCN/Tigerfitness/Longshots/Easton double-dipped eventual USSSA "C" World runner-up PRI/Easton 11-6 and 11-10 for the title. The winners battled all the way through the losers' bracket after suffering an opening round loss.

Also in June, Pastime will host the 31st Annual Worth-Bud Light-Queen City Classic, which features divisions for Women's Class "B," "C" and "D" teams and is Greater Cincinnati's longest running women's tournament. Last year, Dented Bats polished off Fraley's 12-7 in the championship game of the "C" division to rack up their fifth title of the year, while in the "D" division, SOS Softball successfully defended their title, drilling Hill & Griffith 10-3 in the finals to wrap up a 5-0 outing.

Tournament packets or fliers for all five of Pastime Park's NIT's can be downloaded from the park's website beginning January 31st.

At the state level Pastime Park will host the USSSA Men's Southern One-Pitch State Tournament on Sunday, August 9th (for Men's "C," "D" and "E" teams), and the Ohio Class "E" State August 22-23.

Last year's Ohio USSSA Men's "E" State was also held at the Park, where it facilitated 50 teams.

"We're proud to be hosting this important event for the tenth time," says Pastime manager Steve Bruck. "We anticipate having a lot of local teams participate, especially from our own park."

Pastime Park also conducts an extensive schedule of USSSA qualifying tournaments that attract some 100 tri-state teams to the facility annually.

"We provide good umpiring and nice awards, and most of our tournaments are held on one day," points out Bruck.

Most prominent of Pastime's qualifiers are its two monster "C-D-E" season "kickoff" tournaments - the 11th Annual Pastime Park "Spring Open" on February 28-March 1, and the 11th Annual "Round Robin Spring Tune-Up" on March 7-8. These events have traditionally marked the opening of the tournament season in Greater Cincinnati.

While both events were rained out in 2008, the Spring Open drew a combined 26 teams in two divisions in 2007, while the Round Robin Spring Tune-Up attracted 22 teams.

Other "Special Events" slated for Pastime Park include the 8th Annual "Bash For Cash" on March 14-15, and two one-pitch jacket tournaments held on the Memorial Day and Labor Day holidays. The "Cincysoftball.com Big 'E' and the Big 'D' World Qualifiers" will be held on back-to-back Saturdays - April 25th and May 2nd. Both events, which are sponsored by Cincysoftball.com, feature unique formats along with a generous package of paid World berths and travel expense. Pastime's other noteworthy returning slow pitch events will be two "Iron Man" round robins, the 4th Annual "King of the Park," a free event for Pastime league teams, and the 6th Annual "Cincinnati World Series of Softball."

"Iron Man II," slated for April 11, and "Iron Man III," to be held August 15, are "grueling tests of stamina," says Pastime's Steve Bruck.

"We guarantee teams seven games, and the winner more often than not isn't the best team in the tournament, but the team with the most endurance," he says.

Bruck calls "The King of the Park" Tournament, scheduled for Sunday, August 16th, "a fun day of softball, cornhole and prize drawings given to our park teams in appreciation of their choosing Pastime to play their leagues.

"This is a neat tournament and day because it gives us at the park a chance to be with our teams, meet and talk with players and fans, and just really enjoy a day at the park of 'easy going' softball."

Bruck says that in addition to the fact that there is no tournament entry fee, there is also no gate fee charged during the "King of the Park."

Bruck says that the park's World Series, to be held August 8th, "has become one of our most exciting events" due to an enticing package of USSSA post-season berths and travel expense.

"We are trying to give teams something different in tournament play," says Bruck of his park's special events. "And these are all one day tournaments at a cost that teams can feel they are getting more games and more fun for their money."

Round robins are also held at the park for Men's C, D and E teams every Saturday, Saturday night, Sunday and holiday from February 28th through October 25th The tournaments climax with the top sixteen teams (based on points awarded for participation) competing in the "Round Robin Championship Series" on Sunday, September 20.

Riverstar Calendar Boasts Four NIT's, Round Robin Series, Private Events

Four USSSA National Invitational Tournaments, an enterprising new Round Robin Championship Series and the U. A. National Tournament will be among the marquis events on Riverstar Sportsplex's tournament calendar for 2009.

Riverstar's National Invitational Tournaments for 2009 will include two returning events: the 10th Annual Worth-Bud Light-Mike Adler Memorial Mixed Couples "C-D-E" April 26, and the 4th Annual Worth-Bud Light-USSSA Men's Class "C-D" National Invitational Tournament June 27-28.

Two new NIT's are also on tap this year. They are the Worth-Bud Light "D" NIT on March 27-28, and the Worth-Bud Light "C-D" NIT on May 9-10.

State Tournaments slated for Riverstar include the Ohio USSSA Mixed Couples "C," "D" and "E" Championships August 29-30, and the Ohio USSSA Mixed Couples Fall State September 12.

Riverstar's lone national tournament is its hallmark event, the 32nd U. A. National Tournament June 19-21.

Last year in the "C" division of the Mike Adler, High Octane successfully defended their 2007 title by outlasting eventual USSSA Great Lakes National champion Crosley's. While in the "D" division, 2006 U-Trip World Champion Dented Bats bested Speed Kills.

EAP/Wessel/Real Estate Title/QCN/Tigerfitness/Longshots/Easton toppled eventual USSSA "C" World runner-up PRI/Easton 14-12 and 22-7 in a double finals to win Riverstar's "C-D" NIT in June last year. With 26 teams, it was the largest Men's NIT in the area. EAP/Easton had just double-dipped PRI/Easton three weeks earlier in an NIT in Harrison.

In addition to its Mixed NIT, Riverstar offers two other mixed events. The most prominent of these is the Worth-Bud Light-Cincinnati Recreation Commission-USSSA Mixed Couples State Tournament, which has been held at the park for the past nineteen

years. Scheduled for August 29-30, the event attracted 38 teams in three divisions in 2008. High Octane captured the "C" division, eventual World Champion Ohio Onslaught took the "D," and J & M Outcasts/Clayton Homes claimed the "E" title.

Riverstar's other mixed tournament will be September 12, when the Worth-Bud Light-Ohio USSSA Mixed Fall State is slated. Team Drama knocked off In House/Solar Systems in the finals of last year's fall state.

New Riverstar Sportsplex manager Walley Estes has high expectations for his park's mixed tournaments due to a solid base of league teams at Riverstar.

"We sanction almost 100 mixed teams at the park each season, and they've supported our tournaments well through the years," says Estes.

The 31st Annual U. A. National Tournament had 54 entries from a dozen states and Canada last season. Louisville #502/TPS stunned 14-time champion Lansing #333 Black on a three-run, walk-off home run in the bottom of the 7th in the championship game of the "A" division. Chicago Pipefitters Local #597 rallied for seven runs in their final at bat in both the winners' bracket finals and finals to daze Muscle Shoals 13-11 and 12-11 and complete a six-game sweep of the "B" division. "C" division champion Pittsburgh Steamfitters. #449 also swept past six opponents, shutting out Yonkers #21 8-0 in the finals.

"The U. A. Nationals is our signature event," says Walley Estes. "Local #392 does an inimitable job organizing and conducting this tournament. And the competition, sportsmanship, and camaraderie are unmatched by any softball tournament in the region."

Other noteworthy special events being held at Riverstar in 2009 will include the 8th Annual "Bash For Cash" on March 13-15, Men's and Mixed Couples "Pre-Season Round Robins" April 4th and 5th, the "Queen City Classic" BASA NIT May 16-17, and the Riverstar Sportsplex "Spring Season Men's and Mixed Couples League Appreciation Tournament" featuring a free league fee to the summer session.

USSSA qualifiers are held for men's class C, D and E teams, including "Super" qualifiers on April 18 (C-D), April 25 (E), May 31 (E), June 14 (E) and August 2 (D-E). The "C-D" and "D-E" Super qualifiers boast a \$1,100 payout, while the April 26 Super "E" features a whopping \$1,500 cash prize. The May 31 and June 14 events will award \$1,300 each. Three "E" World qualifiers - scheduled for May 10, June 28, and July 19 - will provide the winners with a paid berth to the USSSA "E" World Tournament September 24-27 in Lake Buena Vista, Fl.

Most USSSA Men's and Mixed tournaments at Riverstar are co-sponsored by Worth Sports Company and Bud Light. And most are one day affairs.

New this year at Riverstar is the Round Robin Championship Series, which will be run in two sessions. The first session will climax in a championship on Memorial Day

Weekend called the "Memorial Day Blast," and the second session on Labor Day Weekend in the "Labor Day Hoopla."

"Teams will qualify by earning points in Friday, Saturday and Sunday round robins," says Walley Estes. "There will be a large cash purse at stake both Memorial Day Weekend and Labor Day Weekend. It will be a great way for teams to earn money to help finance their teams."

Riverstar features five lighted, fenced diamonds with concrete dugouts and an infield and outfield irrigation system, scoreboards, heated and air-conditioned concession area, a children's play area, restrooms and showers, and paved parking lot.

"We're putting \$50,000 into field renovations," says park manager Walley Estes. "Also this year we've lowered our gate fee to \$2, and we'll be providing all the softballs."

Estes also points out that Riverstar offers year-round indoor sports at its Entertainment facility adjacent to the park.

"We are currently organizing volleyball, dodge ball and wiffle ball leagues," says Estes. "And special pricing is available for teams playing multiple sports."
